- I-285 opens


<u>1971</u>

- Southern Company builds headquarters





What is a Community Improvement District under Georgia law?

- Defining the district's geographic boundaries
- Securing petitions from 75% of the commercial property owners
- Ratification by local governing authority, and adoption of a charter defining the governing board
- Adoption of a tax millage by the board, which applies only to commercial properties
- Every six years the property owners must vote to continue the district
- Cumberland CID was the first created in Georgia in 1988



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What types of programs and services do Community Improvement Districts provide?


- Funds collected through a CID may be used for the following activities, and often in partnership with cities, counties and State agencies:
- Street and road construction and maintenance
- Parks and recreational areas and facilities
- Water, wastewater or storm water improvements
- Public transportation
- Parking, terminal and dock facilities
- Other services and facilities such as Public Safety







What are the benefits to cities and counties from CID partnerships?









Cities of Dunwoody and Brookhaven with PCIDs

- Bike/Pedestrian improvements: design, right-of-way acquisition and donations, construction funding and project management (includes City use of hotel/motel taxes as a source of matching funds)
- Intersection upgrades and traffic signal improvements
- Landscape installation and maintenance
- Decorative roadway and pedestrian lighting installation and maintenance
- Transit-oriented Redevelopment plan for multi-modal regional transit hub with mixed-use vertical development



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Sandy Springs & Fulton Perimeter CID

- Matching funds for TSPLOST bikepaths and intersection improvements
- Decorative roadway and pedestrian lighting installation and maintenance
- Landscape installation and maintenance
- \$10 Million provided in 2015 to include 12' regional PATH 400 bikeway extension through the new I-285/GA 400 interchange project
- Over \$20 Million in I-285/GA 400 Bridge enhancements/aesthetics planned

• Funding from ARC's Livable Centers Initiative Program (LCI)
